

## PRESS RELEASE

On August 19, 2014, at approximately 2:25 p.m., the Livermore Police Department Dispatch center received a 911 call from a frantic female who stated she had been held captive in her home by her boyfriend for several hours. The home was located in the 500 block of Colusa Way. Officers responded to the residence and contacted the female who stated she had been assaulted by her boyfriend and he had held her captive. The female was unsure if the suspect was still in the residence or had left. She told officers that the suspect had made threats to kill himself and kidnap the female's child. The female told officers that the suspect owns several firearms.

Officers made numerous attempts to contact the suspect inside the residence, including phone calls and the use of a public address system with no response. Officers eventually entered the residence and found that the suspect was not inside. A police K-9 unit was used in clearing the residence.

Investigators are still working at the scene trying to determine what had occurred and trying to locate the suspect. At this time there is no belief that anyone in the neighborhood or community are in danger from the suspect.

Due to the ongoing investigation, the involved party's names will not be released. Both the involved male and female are known to LPD, and there has been a history of police related calls to the residence.
