Each year the Livermore Police Department encourages community members to take part in National Night Out. The number of neighborhoods participating has grown each year. In 2014 there were 31 neighborhood parties. That number grew to 42 in 2015, and to 54 in 2016. This year, LPD's goal is to have 70 neighborhoods getting together to celebrate National Night Out with us.

You can host an event, attend an event, and encourage all your friends, family, and co-workers to participate in National Night Out. We are currently identifying hosts who are willing to help organize a National Night Out event in their neighborhood. Hosting an event can be as simple or as extravagant as anyone desires. Some neighborhoods have block parties, BBQs, Potlucks, Ice Cream Socials, and kiddle related activities such as bounce houses and water balloon races.
