## City Holds Community Workshop to Discuss Livermore Climate Action Plan and Reducing GHG Emissions

*Public Invited to Attend, Learn More and Comment*

**Livermore, Calif., April 18, 2011**—The City of Livermore (City) is holding a community workshop April 28 to educate the public about and get input on the Livermore Climate Action Plan (CAP).

The goal of the CAP is to outline activities that will reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) emission levels produced within the City. The reduction goal of 15 percent below 2008 conditions by 2020 was adopted in the Climate Change Element of the Livermore 2025 General Plan. Implementation of the CAP will support the statewide effort to reduce emissions in California to 1990 levels by 2020 under Assembly Bill 32, the California Global Warming Solutions Act.

Some emission-reduction activities included in the CAP will be related to increasing the use of clean, renewable energy; making transportation choices that result in fewer emissions; recycling and reusing; and increasing water conservation efforts.

The workshop will be held Thursday, April 28 at the Livermore Area Recreation & Park District, Robert Livermore Community Center in the Larkspur Room from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. The facility is located at 4444 East Avenue in Livermore. A short presentation will begin at 7:30 p.m. followed by a discussion period and an open house where attendees can ask questions of City staff and view informational displays.

The City encourages community participation at both this workshop and during the CAP's implementation in the effort to reduce production of GHG emissions within Livermore. By spearheading conservation efforts, connecting with colleagues to make a difference at work, and mobilizing together, the community can help achieve the goals of the CAP and create a healthier place to live, work and play.
