Livermorium Element -- Livermore is part of the Periodic Table! The International Union of Pure and Applied Chemistry officially named element 116 as **Livermorium**, symbol **Lv**, earlier this month. The name honors both the City and the LLNL scientists that discovered it. Livermorium is produced when calcium-48 ions are smashed into a target of curium-248. Lv exists from between 50-125 milliseconds before decaying. BTW, this is not the first element connected with our wonderful City. Lawrencium, element 113, was named for LLNL founder E. O. Lawrence.

Pipeline work is scheduled for completion in mid-June, and roadway resurfacing should be done by the end of July. Infrastructure rehabilitation is vital for Livermore since sewer lines don't last forever, and no neighborhood wants an unexpected geyser in their street.
