

**IN THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LIVERMORE, CALIFORNIA**

**A RESOLUTION OF CONTINUED LOCAL EMERGENCY**

On March 16, 2020, the City Council adopted a resolution, *Ratifying the Proclamation of the Director of Emergency Services Concerning the Existence of a Local Emergency* (Resolution No. 2020-033). The local emergency proclamation concerns conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property, which have arisen within the city of Livermore due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Since then, the City Council regularly adopted resolutions determining the need for continuing the local emergency pursuant to California Government Code section 8630 (Resolution Nos. 2020-078, 2020-133, 2020-166, and 2020-207).

The State continues to implement its *Blueprint for a Safer Economy* to allow Californians to gradually reopen while preserving public health in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. On November 16, 2020, the State moved several counties, including Alameda County, back into the Purple Tier, which is the most restrictive level in the State's reopening framework.

The County of Alameda's Shelter-in-Place order, modified many times over the past eight months, remains in place due to the regional effects of COVID-19.

On November 17, 2020, the Public Health Officer for the County of Alameda issued Emergency Order No. 20-17 that suspended portions of his prior Order No. 20-15 regarding Essential Businesses and Additional Businesses, and deferred to the State Public Health Officer's *Blueprint for a Safer Economy* to define the conditions under which these businesses could operate based upon Alameda County's tier.

On November 19, 2020, the State Public Health Officer issued a limited stay at home order that prohibited gatherings by persons of different households between the hours of 10:00 p.m. through 5:00 a.m. That order is effective from November 21, 2020 through December 21, 2020.


Due to these conditions, City staff reported that the emergency conditions identified by the proclamation still exist today. Staff recommended the City Council continue the proclamation of a local emergency.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the City Council of the City of Livermore has reviewed the March 13, 2020 proclamation of local emergency the City Council ratified on March 16, 2020 (Resolution No. 2020-033) and finds that conditions warrant continued maintenance of that proclamation of local emergency due to the COVID-19 pandemic.


On motion of Council Member Coomber, seconded by Mayor Marchand, the foregoing resolution was passed and adopted on December 14, 2020, by the following vote:
